ABOUT THE ROUTE

On this walk, you'll encounter a cultural melting pot that's also rich in history, from typical Amsterdam markets to Jewish traditions. There are lots of trendy foreign restaurants offering lunch or dinner. Artis, Amsterdam's zoo, is also on this walk—for children, combine a stop there with the fascinating and often overlooked Tropenmuseum (Museum of the Tropics).

ALL DISTRICTS

Oost (East) is perhaps Amsterdam's most varied neighborhood. Here you'll find the Indische buurt, where street names and the Tropenmuseum recall a colonial past. Hip and exotic blend perfectly here—on the Javastraat, you'll find a growing number of trendy coffee houses, boutiques, and restaurants, interspersed with multicultural shops. The locals actively encourage this melting pot, and rightly so—what could be nicer than buying reasonably priced vegetables and then drinking a perfect cup of coffee next door?

Next is the Dapperbuurt, with its genuine old Amsterdam character and famous Dappermarkt. Linnaeusstraat has a nice bar on every corner, including the popular Bieruin, Amsterdam's only real beer garden. The Dapperbuurt borders on the green Plantagebuurt, where, in addition to Artis zoo, you'll find the former Jewish quarter. Jewish traditions are respectfully preserved at the Jewish Historical Museum and synagogue. At the Verzetsmuseum (Dutch Resistance Museum), you can learn all about Jewish history and World War II.

In the midst of all this lies the vibrant Oosterpark, where all the cultures of East Amsterdam mingle. Its monuments recall a turbulent history of slavery, as well as more recent events, such as the murder of Dutch film director Theo van Gogh in 2004. At the Tropenmuseum, which sits at the edge of the park, you can discover more about cultures and customs from around the world.

Oost can be combined with De Pijp, a melting pot of yuppies and market sellers. Once a district for blue-collar workers, today De Pijp has become trendy. There's always something happening on the Albert Cuypmarkt, with its many shops, stalls, and cafés. Somewhere in the middle of the market you'll find the statue of André Hazes, who was born and raised in De Pijp. Sarphatipark is situated near the market and is one of the city's smaller but perhaps most beautiful parks.

ROUTE DIRECTIONS (ca. 10.60 km)



waLK 5 (ca. 7,5 / 10 km)

Start at the Drover s Dog . From here cross the square and turn left down Sumatrastraat, turn right onto Javastraat . On Javaplein check out and behind it and . Cross the street and turn into Borneostraat, to Amsterdam East s hotspot . Then cross the street diagonally and take the first left. Turn right onto Javastraat . Walk under the railway to the Dappermarkt . Follow the road to and . On Linnaeusstraat turn right . Continue and cross the road at the roundabout for the Tropenmuseum . Decide whether or not to follow the short or long walk.

Long walk: turn into Mauritskade, cross the first bridge and follow Plantage Middenlaan . Continue until you reach Meester Visserplein, keep left and turn left after the synagogue onto Jonas Daniël Meijerplein . Cross the bridge and turn left onto Hortusplantsoen. Keep right at the fork and swing over Plantage Mudegracht through the Plantagebuurt, until you reach Plantage Middenlaan again. Continue to the Tropenmuseum to continue the route.

Short walk: Follow Linnaeusstraat to the entrance to the Oosterpark . Walk through the park and leave it at the monument .

Walk through Beukenweg to Beukenplein . Go back, left onto Tweede Oosterparkstraat. Turn first right and at the end left into Eerste Oosterparkstraat. Continue to Wibautstraat, cross the road and turn right. Take the second left . Exit the street over Nieuwe Amstelbrug and walk via Ceintuurbaan to de Pijp . Continue until Tweede Jan Steenstraat. Turn left and then left again onto Eerste Sweelinckstraat . Turn right onto Govert Flinckstraat and then take the first left. Continue until or earlier turn onto the Albert Cuypstraat . Follow the street until Ruysdaelkade. Stay on the side next to the water and then turn left and left again. Continue to Sarphatipark , enter via the first entrance on the right. Walk around the park or follow the path to come out by the exit. Follow Sarphatipark street a little to the left . Then turn right onto Ceintuurbaan . Turn left on Ferdinand Bolstraat and walk to Cornelis Troostplein. Relax with a freshly brewed beer .

1 DROVER'S DOG - FOOD & DRINK

Start the day with a taste of Australia. Drover's Dog has a super-friendly Ozzie atmosphere. And Australians know how to breakfast – choose from sweet, savoury, spicy or crispy. 'Bog in' to the Drover's own full cooked 'brekkie' – a 'ripper' combination of fried eggs, sausages, tomatoes, spinach and mushrooms. 'Don't knock it till you've tried it!' That goes for the 'Roof' too!

2 JAVA BOOKSHOP - SHOPPING

Java Bookshop was once a bit out of place in this neighbourhood, but the hidden gem of a bookshop has now come into its own. Take time to browse among a wide selection of Dutch and English world literature, cooking and children's books, all in a homely atmosphere. The enthusiastic staff are happy to let you make up your mind over a cup of coffee and something tasty.

3 BERLAGEBLOKKEN - SIGHTS

Berlage didn't only design Amsterdam's stock exchange – the Berlageblokken, built (1911-1914) to accommodate workers, were inspired by British social housing, and today are listed buildings. It was important that there should be sufficient greenery, so the accommodation includes small parks as well as inner courtyards with gardens. The apartments underwent a substantial renovation at the end of the 1960s.

4 BADHUIS JAVAPLEIN - FOOD & DRINK

Badhuis Javaplein was one of the last bathhouses to be built in Amsterdam (1942) and is now a trendy restaurant-café. The building also previously housed a Hindu temple and a second hand shop. Today it has again become the meeting place for the neighbourhood. Shower heads have made space for beer taps and an open fireplace. Only the tiled wall behind the bar recalls the place where women once washed.

5 WILDE ZWIJNEN - FOOD & DRINK

Sample high quality Dutch food in atmospheric surroundings at Wilde Zwijnen (Wild Boar). Seasonal dishes are made, as far as practicable, with local Dutch produce. In autumn the menu includes dishes with such wonderful names as in Limburgs grottenbierbeslag gefrituurde mergelgrotchampignons (fried Limburg Mergel cave mushrooms in beer batter), or

venison stew. Reserve a place and look for your name chalked on the table.

6 JANSEN VINTAGE - SHOPPING

8 HARTJE OOST - SHOPPING

Hartje Oost (Heart of East) is one of the latest additions to the Javastraat. It's a coffee boutique, which means good coffee, fashionable clothing, fresh sandwiches and cake, plus handmade jewellery. The boutique's owners aim to only sell products that tell a story – ecological, sustainable, fair trade, local and original. They combine ingredients from businesses in and around Javastraat, like Peking Duck from the Asian shop, with sourdough


1. Fold the last page (the map) in four, as depicted on the right (with the printed side facing up) and put aside for now.
